

The Shelton Lakes Recreation Path (4.0 mi.) is handicapped-accessible. Parking is at the Dog Park.

Oak Valley Trail (red blazes) is a "lollipop loop" with a stem of 0.4 mi. and a loop of 1.2 mi.

The Paugussett Trail (blue blazes) is a regional hiking trail established in the 1930s that leads to Monroe.

The Dog Paw Path (0.2 mi.) is marked with white dog print blazes. It leads from the Dog Park to the Rec Path.

The Flower Trail (0.25 mi.) is marked with red flower blazes. It leads from the Rec Path to Eklund Garden.
